



COVID Catch up Funding Expenditure Report (2020/21)

The government has announced £1billion of funding to support children and young people to catch up with their education following the impact of the coronavirus in the past two school years. This included a one-off universal £650 million catch-up premium for the 2020 to 2021 academic year to ensure that schools have the support they need to help all pupils make up for lost teaching time. The £650 million universal Catch-Up Premium Funding has been made available for all state-funded schools and is calculated on a per pupil basis of £80. Fellside will receive £16,880 for the academic year 2020 – 2021.

Though funding has been calculated on a per pupil basis, schools are using the sum available to them as a *single total from which to prioritise support* for pupils according to their need. The catch-up premium has been designed to mitigate the effects of the disruption caused by Covid-19 and as such, the grant will only be available for the 2020 to 2021 academic year.

Schools have the flexibility to spend their funding in the best way for their cohorts and circumstances of their communities. As with all government funding, school leaders must be able to account for how this money is being used to achieve the central goal of schools getting back on track and teaching a normal curriculum as quickly as possible. At Fellside, we will use this funding for specific activities to support pupils to catch-up for lost teaching over the previous months

| Purchase of Laptops Insufficient quantity of laptops from the DfE resulted in the need to purchase additional devices (x6) to support remote learners without access to technology at home | £2770 | Continued access to home learning via a digital device will ensure that any resulting gaps in learning as a result of school closure are minimised. No child will be left behind as a result of not having the use of technology at home. |
| Phonics and Early Reading Provision Subscription to Little Wandle SSP for teaching of phonics, including purchase of new decodable readers | £4500 | Improvement in resourcing of phonics and early reading programme (including purchase of fully decodable reading books) to support catch-up in KS1 |
| Increasing Teaching Capacity (KS1 Interventions) Staffing for an additional TA in KS1 | £4000 | To support catch-up in small group/1:1 sessions – maths and English provision. Outcomes measured via teaching assessment and NFER periodic testing |
