Attach paper in a variety of different ways. Combine materials into a mixed media image.

Sticky Knowledge:

To know that collages can be made from a variety of media and by layering, folding, crumpling, fringing, creasing and tearing materials.

Accumulation of Technical Skill How are abstract images created fusing a selection of shapes and patterns? Practise folding and cutting paper strips to create repeated shape patterns. Use shapes to create Images of a snail. Create a collage inspired by the work of Henri Matisse The Snail'. How are images created from a series of images and media? Create a collage inspired by the work of Romare Bearden. Select colours and images from a range of magazine images and coloured paper to create a simple image. **Innovation and Application** How can you combine the style of two artists? Design and create an image using a selection of shapes to make an underwater image of a crab. Create a background of fish with folded paper strips, and add to the top the image of a crab created through using semi circles and triangles in the style of Matisse (could be completed as a group) Use a range of collage techniques to create a desired effect. Creative Reflection Is your artwork effective? Decide what has been effective on the collage. Decide what could be improved next time. Discuss which feature draws the eye. **Thinking Deeper-**How could this technique be applied in other scenes?
