#### Nursery

#### Year Five

In maths, children have multiplied unit fractions by integers and used their knowledge of factors to simplify fractions. Children used a four figure grid reference on a map. #### Reception

Children in Reception have enjoyed the book Shifty McGifty and Slippery Sam. In their own writing, they have made inserts for Christmas cars, which they have made, along with calendars. They have enjoyed some early maths, using 1p and 2p coins in their role play shop. Children have talked about making good choices and showing kindness to friends, alongside saying sorry and why it is important to do so. They have taken part I lots of movement for RUNDerland, with lots of dancing, the Daily Mile, bike play and yoga.
